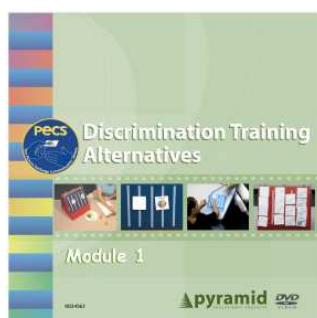

### New Website to Aid Screening for ASD

A new American website called Autism Speaks launched at the end of 2007. The site is aimed at helping parents and doctors increase their awareness of behavioural differences between babies with typical development and those with autism by showing videos of each.

The hope is that the visual information will promote early detection and intervention.

The site supports the view that parents are usually the first to notice possible problems in their children and should have as much information as possible to either rule out their suspicions or, if needed, obtain a quicker diagnosis and access to treatment.

The site is clear that not every child who exhibits the behaviours shown will actually have any problems but several specialists in autism have described it as a helpful tool for parents and doctors.
